The Preclusion Appeals Committee has considered your appeal against preclusion and has decided **you will be precluded from your program, <Program Name>.**

The Committee has denied your appeal based on the following: **<PAC reasons for decision to preclude>.**

What does it mean to be precluded?

As your appeal was unsuccessful, you will be precluded from your program. This means:

- Your enrolment in your program will be discontinued.
- You will be prevented from studying in this program, or a program in the same discipline, for the next two years.
- Application for re-admission will follow normal procedures and is not guaranteed.
- If you gain re-admission you will be classified as a new student for the purposes of assessing fees or eligibility for Commonwealth support or assistance.

If you are an international student and hold a student visa please note that:

- Preclusion from your program constitutes a breach of your student visa. If you are precluded, the University is required by law to notify the Department of Home Affairs. This results in cancellation of your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) and may affect your student visa.
- As a condition of your student visa, you are required to maintain satisfactory academic progress and attendance. This means you must continue your studies while any appeal is being considered.
- The University is obliged maintain your CoE while any appeal is ongoing.

What happens now?

You may have grounds to appeal this decision to the Student Appeals Committee if you believe that:

- i. The relevant policy and/or procedures were not correctly followed and this resulted in disadvantage to yourself; and/or
- ii. new information that supports your case for appeal has become available that was not available at the time the decision was made and which should be taken into consideration; and/or
- iii. evidence of factual errors made can be provided, that affected the decision given to you.

Please note that if you intend to appeal to the Student Appeals Committee, you must do so by **SAC Appeal Due Date>**. If you do not have grounds to appeal, your preclusion will be actioned after this date.
